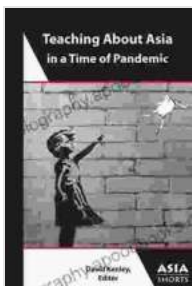


Teaching About Asia in the Time of Pandemic: A Guide for Educators

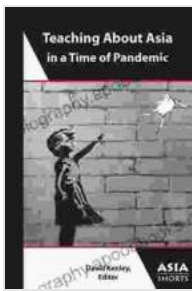
